POST GRADUATE DAY

Wednesday, November 6th

At 9 A.M. Gray Line buses will transport the group from the Statler Hotel to the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology. Major Daniel Stowens will present "Central Nervous System Diseases of Early Infancy" and Dr. Webb Haymaker will discuss "Clinical and Pathological Aspects of Colloid Cysts." A short tour of in-

teresting points at the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology will be available.

Gray Line buses will then take the group to the National Institute of Health where a luncheon will be served. A brief summary of the work of the Neurological Institute and its organization will be presented. This will be followed by a lecture-demonstration on hypothermia, to be followed by a report on the pathological changes associated with hypothermia and the relationship of low temperature states to cerebal edema and the blood-brain barrier as applied to neurosurgery. Finally, there will be a report on the physical analysis of temporal lobe seizures. The use of polygraphic recording in the estimation of the type, origin, and severity of the seizures will be demonstrated.

The group will return to the Statler Hotel by Gray Line buses.
