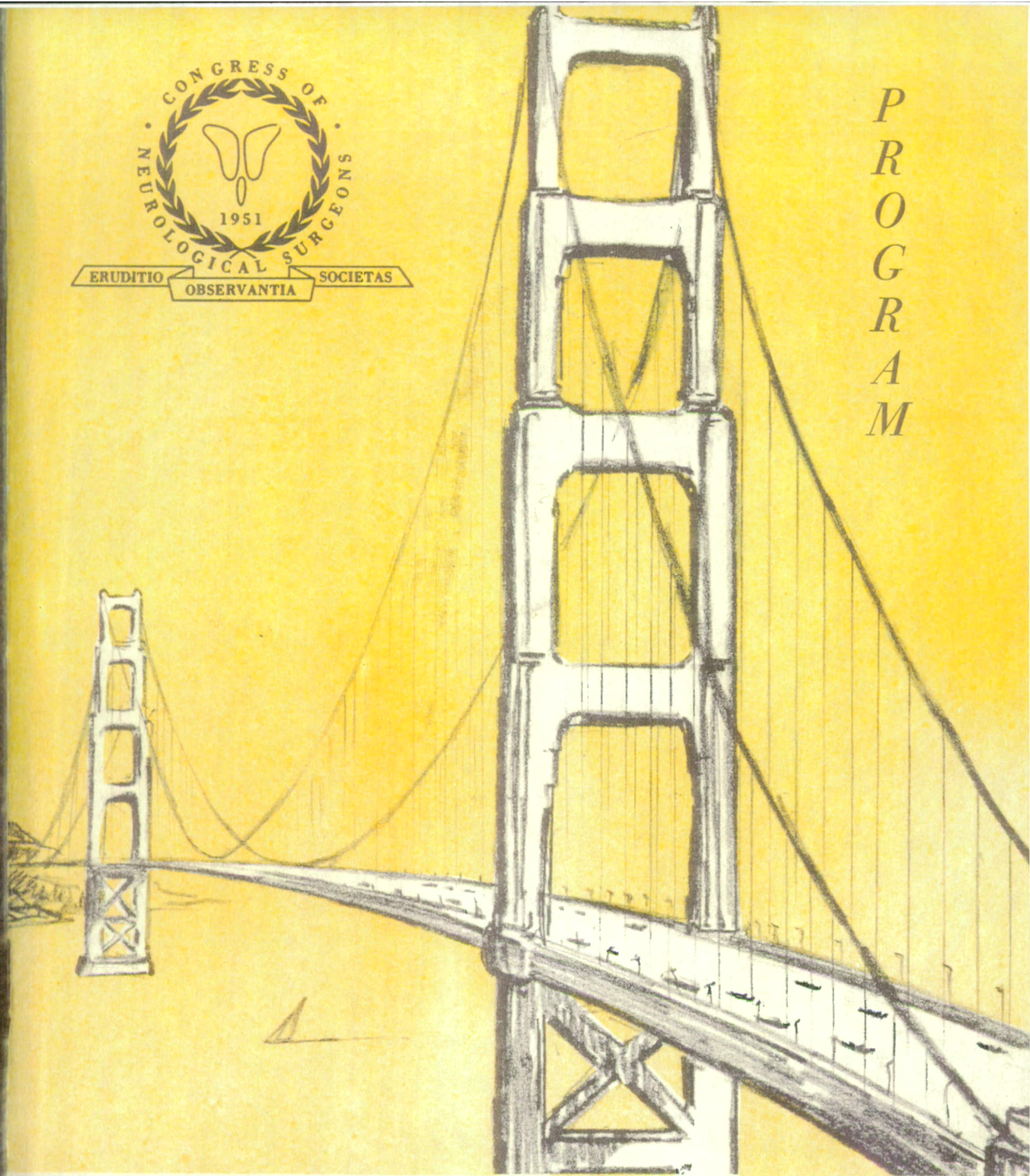

I am sure that all who attended the Sixteenth Annual Meeting will concur that the Congress' first venture outside the continental United States lived up to our expectations. The setting of San Juan and the program format of holding scientific sessions for only half a day, in order to enjoy the many attractions of the Island, made for a most enjoyable meeting.

Dr. Hugo Krayenbühl came through in the tradition of our past foreign Honored Guests. This outstanding European teacher and clinician presented his varied and valued experience in his chosen subject extremely well. The remainder of the scientific program, as executed by Bill Coxe and his Committee, was outstanding. The first Seminars in Fundamental Neurological Surgery, the consummation of which was largely due to the efforts of Bill Hunt, was well attended and received. A special accolade should go to Dr. Norman Allen, Chairman of the Section of Neurology at Ohio State University, for his erudite yet lucid presentation in the field of neurochemistry.
