HISTORY CONGRESS OF NEUROLOGICAL SURGEONS

Nine neurological surgeons met in Chicago on February 24th 1951 to discuss the formation of a new neurosurgical society. This group decided to hold an organizational meeting on May 10, 1951 in St. Louis. The 22 founding members of the Congress met on that date and selected the name "Congress of Neurological Surgeons". The first annual meeting was held in Memphis November 15-17, 1951 with an attendance of 63 members, 17 guests and 9 guest speakers. The second annual meeting was held in Chicago November 6-8, 1952 with Professor Herbert Olivecrona as the first Honored Guest. In November, 1953 the Executive Committee authorized the publication of Clinical Neurosurgery. In June, 1956 the Executive Committee authorized the publication of the Directory of Neurological Surgeons in the United States. A distinguished new journal, Neurosurgery, was first published by the Congress in 1977.

The Congress has now developed maturity but has not lost the youthful enthusiasm and broad participation of members that has guided the growth of the Congress for almost 33 years.
