

Call

- Two call pools
- 1. Methodist call Primary call with APP. Chief (PGY 6 or 7) comes in for cases.
- 2. Campus call covering Riley, VA, Eskenazi, and University. Chief (PGY 4 or 5) comes in for cases.
- Philosophy is to share call burden throughout all years so not overwhelming for any single year.

PGY 1 – 6 calls a month

PGY 2 – 7 calls a month

PGY 3 – 5-6 calls a month

PGY 4 – Chief call (VA and Eskenazi), 2-4 primary calls/mo (when at Methodist)

PGY 5 – 4-6 chief calls at Methodist a month

PGY 6 – Methodist Chief call

PGY 7 – 2-4 chief calls a month







