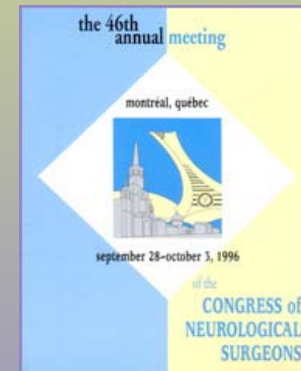

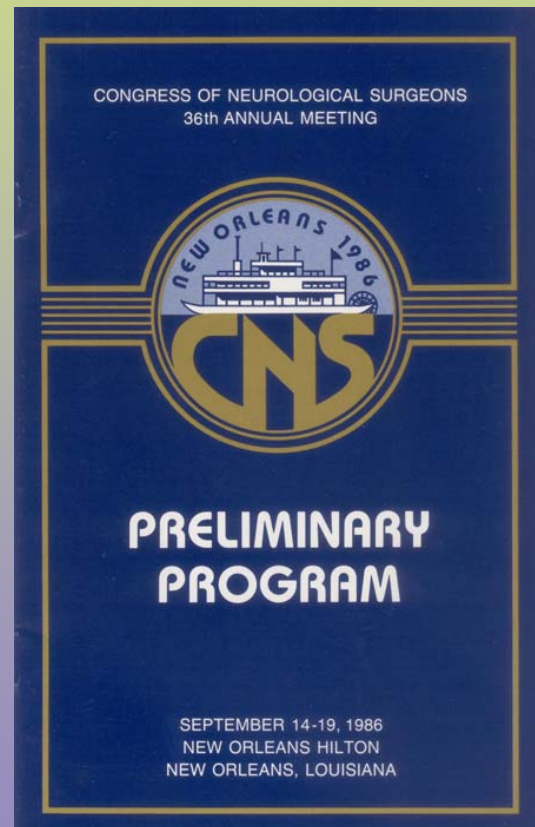

M. Gazi Yasargil

The honored guest for the 1986 Annual Meeting of the Congress of Neurological Surgeons in New Orleans, Louisiana is M. Gazi Yasargil. Professor Yasargil was born July 6, 1925 in Lice, Turkey. He was raised in Ankara following the Turkish revolution. His formal education was heavily weighted toward the humanities, but a strong parental influence and that of a friend who was Professor of Neurology caused him to turn his attention to the sciences. He began his medical studies at Friedrich Schiller University in Jena, Germany in 1944. He subsequently transferred to the medical school of Basel, Switzerland and received his medical degree in 1950. His early work concerned the biochemical aspects of psychiatric disorders as well as
