Dear Fellow Congressmen:

It is time to start making plans for the September 16-20, 1969 meeting of the Congress at the Sheraton-Boston Hotel in Boston, Massachusetts. President Paul Sharkey and Annual Meeting Chairman, George Becker, are arranging an excellent scientific and a unique social program.

BOSTON, THE CITY

The Hub City of New England is the site of the 19th Annual Congress Meeting. September is a particularly beautiful time in which to enjoy historic Boston. Most days are sunny and there is just a hint of the coming cooler seasons in the evening air.

For openers, a person might walk the exciting 1-1/2 mile Freedom Trail. This walk starts by the Boston Common, passes the Granary Burial Grounds -- where lie John Hancock, Samuel Adams, and many other persons of historical significance--through the Boston Massacre Site, and on to the Old North Church. It is difficult to imagine so hallowed an area in American History. Boston is also a cultural and intellectual center. Museums of art, science, and history abound. All are accessible via the MTA (Metropolitan Transit Authority).

The oft-heard phrase, "Boston, the Home of the Bean and the Cod", only reminds us that elegant eating is everywhere in Boston and its environs. New England Style Clam Chowder, daily dug native clams, Baked Boston Scrod, and ocean fresh lobster are all outstanding "provincial" dishes.

The Congress meeting in the Sheraton-Boston Hotel, the flagship of the 115 hotel international chain. It is located in the new Prudential Center, a 31 acre business, shopping, civic, residential complex in historic Back Bay. The focal point is the 52 story Prudential Tower.

BOSTON MEETING

There are some slight changes in the format of the meeting this year. The meeting will be four days in length. The usual Saturday morning session will be eliminated so that those members who are going on to the World Congress or who are returning home to free their convening doctors may do so. The Movie Session will be held in the evening.

Transportation, door-to-door Boston to New York, for both members and exhibitors is under investigation at this time.

Attention Program Directors: The residents in training will be provided housing as has been the Congress' custom in the past. To obtain housing this year, the resident must have the identification, provided by the Congress, to present to the hotel personnel. Pre-registration of residents is being stressed this year.

SEMINARS IN FUNDAMENTAL NEUROLOGICAL SURGERY

The title of the talk by Dr. Walle Nauta of MIT will be announced in the next Newsletter.

In addition to Dr. Hamby, our Honored Guest, the faculty includes Richard Schneider, Lawrence Pool, G. Of course, Mr. Melvin Belli will talk on Medico-Legal problems.

SCIENTIFIC EXHIBITS
