1987 CNS Meeting: Baltimore

The 1987 Annual Meeting of the Congress of Neurological Surgeons will be held in Baltimore, Maryland, from October 25-29, 1987, in the Baltimore Convention Center. Rooms have been reserved in three excellent nearby hotels, the Hyatt Regency Baltimore on the Inner Harbor, the Sheraton Inner Harbor Hotel, and the Omni International Hotel.

Social Events: Baltimore

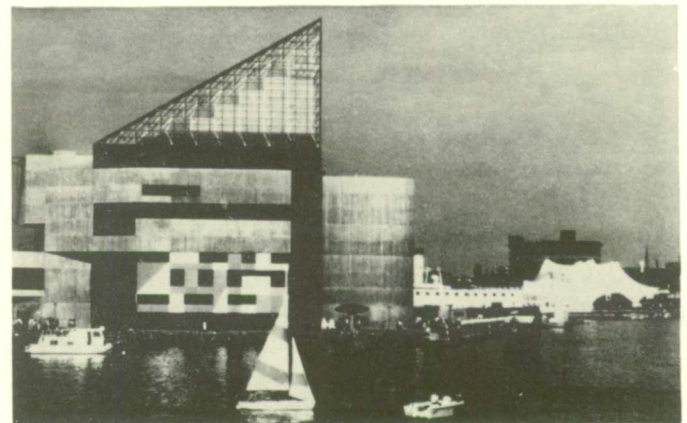
